



Science for Redesigning of Science, Technology and Innovation Policy (SciREX) The Hub Institutions for Fundamental Research and Human Resource Development Program **2015 SciREX Summer Camp: Call for Student Delegates** 

## 1.Objective

As part of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology's program of Science for the Redesigning of Science, Technology and Innovation Policy (SciREX), an annual **Summer Camp** will be organized for students and faculty members from five participating institutions (the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies, the University of Tokyo, Hitotsubashi University, Osaka University, Kyoto University, and Kyushu University) in order to create an environment for learning, discuss common themes, share research results, and engage in interdisciplinary exchange. Our goal is to bring together graduate students with different backgrounds and contribute to the formation of wide-ranging networks by providing a venue and opportunity to discuss common themes, share research results and engage in interdisciplinary exchange.

In 2015, the University of Tokyo will organize the Summer Camp with the theme of **"Bringing Science, Technology, Innovation to the Market: From the perspectives of policy, regulation and national security."** The camp is planned to be held in Inuyama City in Aichi Prefecture with a focus on policies to achieve scientific and technological innovation as a regional industry.

# 3. Travel, Accommodation, and Meal Expenses

Self-financed meals:

The fee for the social gathering on August 21st and lunch on the 22nd and 23rd should be paid by the participant. The sum of 6,000 Japanese Yen in cash will be collected individually on the day of arrival.

\*No lunch is provided on the first day, so please either have lunch in advance or bring a packed lunch with you on the bus.
